May include developing implementation procedures and performance measures to enhance Public Safety programs.

Must have High School Diploma or equivalent and currently enrolled in a bachelors, associates or master's degree program and performing course work toward a degree in city, urban or regional planning, public relations, public administration, public health, emergency management or a related field. The ability to accept or recognize the viewpoints of others; work with a variety of persons from public and private agencies; to prepare written descriptions and summaries that communicate the results of research; experience and enthusiasm for intergovernmental involvement and public communication including group process methods and graphic presentations as well as the ability to use a variety of Microsoft Office applications, including Word, Excel, PowerPoint and Outlook.
